Since 2014 the Eastern Cape Region of SATSA (ECTSA) became the beneficiary especially to assist with developing transplanted athletes in this challenging Region.

Almost a 100 players teed off on 29th December in perfect weather. Steve Hall on 42 points was the individual winner and his four-ball team was also the Alliance winners on the day, namely Steve, Grant and Neil Morris as well as Paul Joiner.
