Stanley Henkeman is the Executive Director of the Institute for Justice and Reconciliation (IJR) in Cape Town. He is the former HOD for the Building an Inclusive Society Programme at IJR. He previously worked as a teacher, lecturer and manager. Stanley has extensive experience in facilitating learning. He is equally comfortable and effective with grassroots and sophisticated audiences. Stanley is a skilled mediator, public speaker and facilitator. He holds an MA Degree and is currently the Chair of the South African Transplant Sports Association. He also represented South Africa as an athlete at four World Transplant Games.

Stan Henkeman is Exec Director at the Institute for Justice and Reconciliation (IJR) in Cape Town. He is the former HOD for the Building and Inclusive Society Programme at IJR. He previously worked as a Consultant in the field of training, motivation and mentoring. He has extensive experience in facilitating learning, development and service delivery processes for groups of adult learners. He specialises in the areas of Effective Conflict Transformation, Effective Communication, Emotional Intelligence, Change Management, Leadership and Management skills. He has worked in South Africa as well as internationally with governments, civil society and international NGO's. Stan played a pivotal role as facilitator/mediator in the xenophobic crisis in the Western Cape between May and November 2008 and has established himself as a skilled mediator and facilitator of difficult processes. He is equally comfortable and effective with grass roots and sophisticated audiences.

Stan has served on a number of boards and held leadership positions ranging from education, religion, sport and Toastmasters International. At the age of 48, after six years of low quality existence which resulted from a massive heart attack in 2001, Stanley received a heart transplant. Since then he hasn't looked back and is now the National Chair of the South African Transplant Sports Association and has represented South Africa at five World Transplant Games in Australia, Sweden, South Africa, Argentina and Spain respectively, the last three as the Team Captain.

As from 2014 I am National Vice-Chairman for the South African Transplant Sports Association which is fully recognized by the Olympic body SASCO.

In 2011 I participated in the World Transplant Games in Sweden.

In 2013 I participated in the World Transplant Games in Durban and earned a silver medal for golf.

In August 1987 I started my own company. Drawing on my experience and contacts in the shipping and purchasing fraternity I became a consultant, sourcing, buying, and shipping out helicopter spares for corporate as well as government concerns.

Being an able craftsman in my spare time I decided to make this a full-time occupation. I contracted out to Sembel-It. This is a kitchen manufacturing concern and I was tasked with designing, drawing plans on the computer and installing their kitchens and bathrooms nationwide.

In 1997 I decided to diversify and set up my own factory in Sun Valley, Kyalami, manufacturing wooden corporate gifts.

I manufactured trophies for large concerns like Sanlam, Eskom, Telkom, Mnet, DSTV, Sun City, SABC, COSATU and various municipalities.

I approached the Royal and Ancient Golf Association of Scotland to manufacture a wooden golf putter to test the market. These putters were manufactured out of a large variety of indigenous woods and took off well. I stopped manufacturing other wooden products and concentrated mainly on putters.

For 2 successive years I went to America on invitation of the PGA to exhibit my putters at their trade fair in Orlando Florida.

I appeared on Pitch and Putter, SABC 3 and Complete Golfer.

I decided to diversify in making coffins and caskets for the Botswana markets. I was making coffins and caskets for 6 years. I concentrated on the upper-class caskets and coffins i.e. solid wood coffins and dome caskets. I also prepared coffins/caskets fully lined. We were exporting to various buyers in Botswana on a weekly basis. Our factory was fully equipped to do large orders and we could cope with every aspect in coffin making. My skill in operating machinery and machine maintenance is of a very high standard.

During this time, I also worked part time for Transport Intelligence Services supervising the loading of scrap steel on vessels during nightshifts in Cape Town/East London/Port Elizabeth/Durban.

I have been maintaining my own machines and all our templates and workbenches were made by me to speed up the manufacturing chain for efficient delivery.

I have always had an excellent relationship with staff because I have always treated them fairly and with respect. I am very much a "hands on" person and "not afraid to get my hands dirty" manager. This has generated mutual respect from my workers in the advertising, marketing and manufacturing world.

I am presently helping schools, churches and companies with their corporate golf days and my knowledge on golf is of high standard. I am a keen golfer and was involved in playing in the Gauteng better ball league as a full member for Kyalami Country Club. (1996 to 2007)

I am currently a freelance auctioneer after doing my Diploma. I have been doing Auctions for 35 Years but only did my diploma in Feb 2015.

I participated in the SA Transplant Games in October 2014 and qualified for the World Transplant Games in Mar del Plata, Argentina in 2015 where I won a silver medal in the shot put and gold medal and achieved a world record in the discus. I was also the Team Manager.

I participated in the SA Transplant Games in October 2016 and qualified for, and participated in the World Transplant Games in Malaga, Spain in 2017. I was once again the Team Manager.

TRANSPLANT INVOLVEMENT

I was diagnosed at age 13 with Chronic Glomerular Nephritis (1986). In 2007 I went into End Stage Renal Failure (ESRF) & commenced dialysis (HD) at NRC in East London. After 1 year on dialysis, I was fortunate enough to receive a kidney from my sister in law, & was transplanted on the 12th February 2008.

In May 2009 I joined National Renal Care as the Pre-Dialysis Educator, & from then onwards was involved in renal support groups, patient education & monitoring, & family education & support.

Although I no longer work at NRC, I still assist with talks & support groups for renal patients & pre/post-transplant patients.

INVOLVEMENT IN SPORT & TRANSPLANT SPORT

After my transplant, & while still booked off to recover, I started playing lawn bowls socially, & eventually on a competitive level. I also started power walking, which I did for around 5 years, & now I do road running, & have completed 6 half marathons (21kms) since the beginning of 2016.

I am the current Chairperson of the Eastern Cape Transplant Sports Association.

I participated in the SA National Transplant Games in 2008, 2010, 2012, 2014, 2016, & qualified for each of the World Transplant Games (WTG) the following year.

I have taken part in the following WTG:

- 2009 Gold Coast Australia - took part in Lawn Bowls (gold medal: singles), Ten Pin Bowling & Power Walking
- 2011 Gotenborg, Sweden - took part in Ten Pin Bowling & Power Walking
