



BYLAW L: PERTAINING TO REGIONAL STRUCTURES OF SA TRANSPLANT SPORTS ASSOCIATION

Regional Structures will act according to Section IV - 1 & 2 of the Constitution of SATSA as approved in Cape Town on 28 September 2006.

Further to Section IV – 2, Regional structures will be involved in the following actions and activities.

Regions:

1. Will at all times promote the **Vision – Mission and Objectives** of SATSA as set out in Section 1 of the Constitution;
2. Will at all times endeavour to work harmoniously and promote good relationships with other organisations and structures in the organ donation & transplantation environment;
3. Will promote SATSA and the benefits of belonging to the Association to potential new members – Full or Associate. To enrol as many new members as possible and to integrate them into the Association's activities. To this end the following activities are encouraged:
 - 3.1. Making use of local media – Radio & Newspapers – to make SATSA known;
 - 3.2. Getting involved in community projects and activities which has as its aim to promote general health and also Organ donation and Transplantation.
4. Will act as a support base for members in the following areas:
 - 4.1. Participation in regular sport or physical activities;
 - 4.1.1. Arranging specific activities relating to SATSA members or
 - 4.1.2. Assisting or encouraging participation as individuals or as a SATSA Team in regular sporting or other physical activities.
 - 4.2. Participation in the National & World Transplant Games;
 - 4.3. Assisting with the adapting and integration into society after transplantation and keeping up a healthy lifestyle.
5. Will assist National in identifying potential sponsors and building lasting partnerships as far as financial and moral support is concerned.
 - 5.1. To this end National should at all times be kept informed or ideally be directly involved in the negotiations with potential sponsors.

5.2. Regions are not to conclude any agreements or make any promises on behalf of SATSA or even in their personal or regional capacity before approval is received from the EXCOM.
